FIREFIGHTER GRANT SOUGHT

The Danby Fire District recently applied for a grant from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Office of Domestic Preparedness, through their Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program. The District applied for \$79,000 to purchase equipment that will benefit the Danby and West Danby Fire Companies. If awarded, the government will provide 90% (\$71,100) of these funds to the District. In turn, the District is required to provide 10% (\$7,900). Being able to purchase \$79,000 worth of equipment for only \$7,900 is an opportunity the District couldn't let pass.

There are two types of equipment that grant funds will cover if the grant is awarded. One is self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) which are what firefighters wear to breathe air while working within toxic environments. The SCBA used by both companies is 15 to 21 years old. It is still functional, but the District seeks to replace this obsolete equipment with newer SCBA equipped with operational and safety components to protect the wearer, as required by current government standards.

The second requested item is a thermal imaging camera. This camera is not hampered by smoke or dark conditions and can be operated from a safe distance. It uses heat sensing to help firefighters pinpoint the locations of injured or trapped building occupants, eliminating the need for potentially dangerous roomby-room searches routinely performed by firefighters. It can also determine if heat conditions exist behind walls, eliminating the need to damage walls in order to check for fire. The camera can also aid in locating ejected victims of car accidents, especially those that occur at night.

The two fire companies respond to emergency medical and fire incidents within West Danby and Danby, and provide mutual aid assistance as needed to surrounding communities such as Brooktondale, Spencer and Newfield. Not only will this grant help our own community but our neighboring communities as well. Please keep your fingers crossed that we are picked to receive an Assistance to Firefighters grant award. We

should be notified of a decision between May and December and will place an announcement in the Danby Area News when we hear.

TASK FORCE REPORT

The Comprehensive Plan Implementation Task Force has met twice, with members of the community and the Town's three boards (Town, Planning, Board of Zoning Appeals) in attendance. At the first meeting, we agreed to focus first on the largest and most pressing land use issues. The thrust of this effort can be summarized in two questions: "How do we encourage development where we want it?" and "How do we discourage development where we do not want it?" Identifying, exploring, and weighing the options for each of these questions will bring to the forefront the balancing of interests that is key to determining how willing we are as a town to plan and direct the future use of land in Danby.

The Task Force is currently weighing what might be done in the short term to limit development while it explores a range of options. There is agreement that the current regulations offer very little protection. Ideas proposed by residents attending the meetings included: a moratorium on subdivisions of land and housing developments; repeal of the subdivision regulations and creation of Planned Development Districts in their stead; leaving the regulations as they are but reducing the density of building lots in the low density zone; eliminating the exemption from review for lots 5 acres and larger; as well as several suggestions to increase the level of scrutiny for smaller subdivisions so more of them would be subject to Planning Board review and site plan approval. Pros and cons of these and other options will be explored with the objective of agreeing on what short-term action to recommend to the Town Board. There is a sense of urgency based on the group's belief that Danby is undergoing increasing development pressure that threatens the rural character strongly supported by most town residents (as indicated by polls taken in conjunction with creation of the Comprehensive Plan).

The Task Force identified a need for legal advice continued on next page

and expert planning assistance to help explore the various options. Richard Stumbar, the Town Attorney, has been approached concerning legal expertise, and the Tompkins County Planning Department is interested in working with the Task Force. A subset of the group is exploring how that relationship would work. The County is completing its own Comprehensive Plan, which shares many of the same values as Danby's Plan.

The next meeting of the Task Force is at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 12, at the Town Hall. Anyone interested in the work of the group is welcome to join.

PERIODIC REPORT FROM FRANK PROTO TOMPKINS COUNTY LEGISLATURE

As we continue the County's budget review for 2005, a retreat has been scheduled for this month to get the process moving as well as integrate the suggestions from the Special Review Committee. After this review, please keep me abreast of any suggestions you may have. Coupled with this the Assessment Reviews for each town should begin shortly. "Grievance Day" meetings are another opportunity to share your property assessment concerns—watch for the finalized dates!!

The Department of Agriculture and Markets is continuing discussions with the Town of Ithaca regarding the impacts its comprehensive plan is having, or may have, on agriculture. Danby and Caroline officials need to hear your reactions—so do I!

The County Planning Department is shopping its draft County Comprehensive Plan around to the towns now. Danby had its presentation earlier this month; Caroline in May. Please let me hear from you with suggestions, reactions, etc. In the same vein a proposal for establishing a County Executive is being discussed. I'd appreciate your thoughts on this item soon.

Although the Town of Caroline has not received a formal reply to their aquifer study application at this

writing, from the appropriate department, the County is proceeding with its piece as originally promised.

Our intermunicipal group dealing with highways has had several productive meetings. Each participant is bringing ideas which may help all save some money by working together.

Please mark your calendars—our coffee sessions in Danby are generally the Tuesday following the Town Board's regular monthly meeting at the Danby Market, 9:30–11 am (time approximate). Good opportunity to meet and chat! Thanks again to both establishments.
