The next event in the Danby Concert Series will be a recital of solo Bach suites for cello by Elizabeth Simkin.

Simkin is one of the leading cellists in the Ithaca area. She has been on the performing faculty at Ithaca College for 10 years, and has served as principal cellist for the Cayuga Chamber orchestra. She is a member of several chamber groups, including Ensemble X, the Ariadne Quartet, and the Taliesen Trio. She has performed extensively in the US and abroad. One of her teachers was the world-famous cellist Janos Starker.

She is currently working on a recording project of the complete Bach cello suites, and will be performing 3 of them at this concert. These are incredibly rich and challenging works for the cello, and Elizabeth Simkin is a compelling performer who can bring them alive for her audience. (Another recent project is her first son, Cole, born last fall.)

BOARD CONSIDERS REZONING MORATORIUM

As was mentioned in last month's task force report, current regulations in Danby offer limited protection of Danby's rural character. Protection of Danby's rural resources is called for in the recently-adopted Comprehensive Plan. How do we do that? Are we losing them while we consider the question? Should we "stop the action" temporarily while we examine our options and make changes to our regulations to bring them into line with the comprehensive plan?

The town board is considering such a move. A 6month moratorium on land divisions and rezoning applications would temporarily stop the creation of new building lots (those already created could still be built upon, and there is a provision for appeal in the event of hardship). The board is very interested in knowing whether or not you think this measure is needed to prevent a rush of applications while we do the work of revising our laws and to solicit the broadest possible input from the public regarding those revisions. The moratorium proposal, itself a local law, will be the subject of a public hearing at 7 p.m. on June 14 at the Town Hall. Come if you can, but comment even if you cannot. To become part of the official hearing record, comments by those not in attendance must be in writing and signed, but other comments, either by phone or email, are welcome. The town clerk will collect emails at danbytownclk@aol.com. You can phone me (Joel Gagnon) at 564-7647 or any other town board member.

This proposal will not pass without broad public support. The town board voted to hold the public hearing on a possible moratorium due to a sense of urgency concerning development pressures in Danby. Unless this sense of urgency is widely shared and finds expression as support for this "time out," we will proceed with the work of the task force without it.

BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS WED., JUNE 2, 7:30 PM

Public hearing to consider a variance of the Zoning Ordinance in order to construct a 1,200 s.f. addition with a minimum rear yard depth of ± 28 feet. The proposed addition would replace a preexisting building wing that had a minimum rear yard depth of ±40 feet. A further request is included to rebuild a preexisting front porch and a portion of the existing dwelling with a minimum front yard depth of ±35 feet. The property is located at 399 South Danby Road.

Public hearing to consider enacting a Local Law entitled "A Local Law Providing for a Moratorium on Rural Land Divisions, Applications for and Approvals of Subdivisions, and Applications for Rezoning." Public hearing to consider a request for a modified Special Permit for the Ithaca Zen Center, with the proposed modifications including proposed use of the dwellings located at 62 Lieb Road and 104 Bald Hill Road for retreat lodgings.

TASK FORCE UPDATE

The May 12 meeting of the Comprehensive Plan Implementation Task Force was dominated by a discussion of the proposed moratorium (see the article about that elsewhere in this issue of the Danby Area News). Those proposing a 23-lot development on 96B opposite Nelson Road stated that they felt specifically targeted by the moratorium (since their application is not yet complete, they would be included). A reprise of the history of the task force and the origins of the moratorium idea emphasized that there was at least as much concern about the lot-by-lot development we have been seeing in town, which equals in magnitude their proposal. Most lot-by-lot development is not subject to any planning board review under the current regulations. A meeting with the town board was agreed to explore possibilities for compromise (which meeting is not yet scheduled, as of this writing).

We briefly touched upon a work plan for the task force. Proposed is a two-pronged approach to implementing the comprehensive plan. First up, and with a short time frame, is to look at the options for protecting open space. We would then decide which, if any, to recommend to the town board for immediate implementation. Secondly, simultaneously, but with a longer time frame, it is proposed that we create a specific vision for Danby's future that is rooted in the comprehensive plan and put in place a package of codes, ordinances, guidelines, procedures, and support structures to help make it happen. We hope to begin that process at the next meeting, which is at 7:30 p.m. on June 9, at the Town Hall.

The town board has approved a contract with the Tompkins County Planning Department to provide support for the work of the task force. The scope of their involvement is being negotiated and will also come up at the next meeting. All are welcome to join the task force and get involved in planning Danby's future.


