DANBY TOWN HISTORY

Tompkins County was formed from parts of Cayuga and Seneca counties on April 17, 1817. Three towns were annexed from Tioga county on March 22, 1822, and a portion was ceded to Schuyler county in 1854.

It lies around the head of Cayuga Lake, SW of the center of the State, is centrally distant 141 miles from Albany, and contains 506 square miles. Its surface consists principally of an upland, broken by a series of ridges extending North and South.

The watershed between Cayuga Lake and the Tioughnioga River occupies the eastern border, and that between the same lake and Susquehanna River the southern. The deep Cayuga Lake valley, 700 ft. below the ridge summits, separates the northern portion into two distinct parts. The eastern portion, declining toward the north, gradually loses its hilly character and spreads out into the rolling lands of Central NY. West of the lake the land does not lessen in height within the limits of the county; but the rough, broken hills change into smooth ridges, with long, gradual slopes.

Danby was formed from Spencer (Tioga county) on February 22, 1811 and transferred to Tompkins county on March 22, 1822. Part of Caroline was annexed April 29, 1839, and a part was ceded to Dryden in 1856.

It lies near the center of the south border of the county. Its surface is broken by ranges of hills extending north and south, 300 to 400 ft. above the valley. Their summits are rounded and their declivities generally steep. The valleys are mere ravines. The principal streams are Cayuga Inlet, flowing north, and numerous small streams, the latter being tributaries either to this or to Owego Creek. The soil is a mixed gravelly and shaly loam, with occasional patches of clay and is well adapted to grazing.

Danby in the north part, contains 3 churches and 50 houses; Beers Settlement (South Danby) near the center, about 12 houses. West Danby is near the west border. The first settlers were Yaple, Dumond, Beers, and Judson in 1797. The first settlers of West Danby were Hogg and Baker. The first church (Congregational) was formed in 1807; Rev. Loring was the first pastor. There are 8 churches in the town, 3 M.E., 2 Bap., Cong., Prot. E., and Swedenborgian.

Free Family Programs for the Danby Community!

These family programs have been designed to appeal to youth of just about any age. Adults are welcome to join us for all programs. Participation is free!

Everything happens on Tuesday evenings, from about 7–8:30pm, at Jennings Pond, just off Bald Hill Road.

July 11: Wild animals. Come explore the animal life of Jennings Pond. We'll be trying to catch some interesting critters as well as taking a look at some recently collected specimens. Nets and guidebooks will be provided.

July 18: **Paper Making**. Take a look at how recycled paper gets made. We'll be mixing up scrap paper in blenders and creating our own paperwork. Whatever you make, you get to take home. Each year it takes volunteer hours to clean the park. The most important part is the dredging of the pond (sea) weed. This is done by taking a 6-foot-long, heavy iron bar out into the depths and dropping it in. After it sinks and becomes entangled in weeds, it is pulled out of the water. The weeds are removed from the bar and the process is repeated over, and over, and over. The dredging, alone, is a huge job and, because of the mild winter, the weed was nice and thick this year.

As is required at all State Parks, Jennings Pond undergoes a thorough inspection by the Department of Environmental Health and a weekly water test.

I would like to extend a big, "Thank You!" to Jim Bond and his crew from the Probation Department. They worked four days in hot humid weather to get the dredging done. I would also like to thank Betsy and Ethan Bibbie, Scott Kozak, and Mason Cusimano for helping with this project.
