DANBY FIRE DISTRICT Applies for Grant

The Danby Fire District has applied for a 2006 Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Assistance to Firefighters Grant. In recent years, FEMA has offered this funding opportunity to aid fire departments nationwide.

During 2004, the District applied for and was awarded \$79,000 to replace our 15+ year old self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) with newer, safer, more reliable SCBA, and to buy a thermal imaging camera to aid in fire fighting and victim location when visibility

> is poor. During 2005, the District again applied for a FEMA grant and received \$13,859 dedicated to in-house training for all our volunteers. The District had a 25% chance of being awarded a grant and we were thrilled to be recipients

twice in a row.

This year, we are reaching for

the stars. We are requesting \$385,000 for a new rescuepumper truck. This truck will replace an engine-tanker built in 1989 and housed at the Danby Fire Station. This 17-year old vehicle has a commercial chassis, a double clutch standard transmission, and is no longer compliant with safety features required by today's standards according to the National Fire Protection Agency.

We propose to replace our engine-tanker with a safer fire truck that has features to support our ability to protect lives and property. We researched this truck by considering current and future needs as our community grows, along with visits to area fire departments that own similar rescue-pumpers. We also discussed specifications with representatives of three major emergency vehicle manufacturers to learn what features are available.

FEMA grants have a very generous cost share requirement. If awarded the \$385,000 grant, FEMA will pay 95% and the District is required to pay only 5%. To put it simply, we would get a \$385,000 fire truck for \$19,250!

The grant application was submitted in April and grants are awarded throughout the end of the year. If awarded the grant, we will have one year to have the truck custom built. Without this award, the District will need to consider investing in the refurbishment of our aging engine, a cost estimated to be in excess of \$100,000 due to the condition of the standard transmission and body rust.

The eight trucks in our fleet range from six to thirty two years old, with an avarage age of 17.4 years; the two engines are 16 and 17 years old. Obtaining this FEMA grant will help us replace an aged vehicle from our fleet at very low cost, so please keep your fingers crossed that the fire district will obtain this grant.

BOND RESOLUTION

Subject to Permissive Referendum

A Resolution adopted...on May 17, 2006 authorizes the issuance of bonds and other obligations to finance the construction, alteration and remodeling of the Town's Highway Garage...in accordance with a Notice of Violation promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency...at a maximum estimated cost of \$385,000. [The town will pay for the project] by the levy of a tax. Under the Local Finance Law, the Project has a period of probable usefulness of ten (10) years.

Notice of Resolution

Subject to Permissive Referendum

A Resolution adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Danby, Tompkins County, New York (the "Town") on July 5, 2006 authorizes the expenditure of up to \$82,000 from the Town Building Capital Reserve Fund for use in financing a portion of the Highway Garage Remediation Project.

RESOLUTION NO.70 OF 2006

Urging the withdrawal of U.S. Military personnel and bases from Iraq.

WHEREAS, the Town of Danby and its citizens strongly support the men and women serving in the United States Armed Forces in Iraq and recognize the sacrifices that each of them is making; and

WHEREAS, the war and the occupation of Iraq:

- 1) have caused the deaths of over 2,500 and serious injury to over 19,000 of our young soldiers;
- 2) have resulted in the deaths of tens of thousands of Iraqi civilians, and the devastation of Iraq's infrastructure:
- 3) have created a training and recruitment ground for terrorists;
- 4) have already cost more than \$294 billion, of which the Tompkins County share is over \$110 million, mon-

ey that could be spent at home for education, health care and property tax relief;

NOW BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Danby, New York, on behalf of the people of Danby, urges our federal government to commence a humane, orderly and comprehensive withdrawal of U.S. military personnel and bases from Iraq; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of the Town of Danby, New York send a copy of this resolution to the President of the United States and to each member of the New York State Congressional delegation.

This Resolution was respectfully submitted to the Town Board of the Town of Danby for their consideration on behalf of 157 registered voters in Danby who signed a petition in favor of this resolution.
