
The Annual Meeting of the Danby Community Council will take place on Thursday January 11, at 7pm in the Danby Town Hall. At the Annual Meeting, the Community Council will present its annual report and its financial report. New Board members will be elected, and there will also be a vote on an amendment to the bylaws.

There are three open seats for Board members. Dan Klein and Eloise Greene, both current Board members, have declared their intention to run again. Anyone who wants to run should notify the Board by January 1. If there are still open seats which no one has declared their intention to fill, then nominations will be taken during the Annual Meeting.

The current bylaws state that one Board seat is designated for a resident of West Danby. A proposed amendment to the bylaws, as passed by the Community Council during its December meeting, would change this designation in the following way: If no residents of West Danby have stepped forward to fill the reserved seat (as has been the case for the past year), that seat may be filled by any resident of Danby.

All Danby residents who are at least 18 years old are eligible to vote. Refreshments will be served.

Please join me this month in welcoming Alan James as a Support Member of Danby Volunteer Fire Company.



SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

Because it is the beginning of a new year, I thought I would review some of the more interesting things that the Town Board has been working on during the past year.

In 2006 we completed the demolition of the old Town barns, cleared up the whole area, and started turning it into something more positive, like a park.

Danby will be involved in a three-year study, funded in part by the federal government, New York State, Tompkins County, and Danby (through money obtained for this by our State Senator, Jim Seward). We need to find out the condition of our water, not only in terms of bacteria, but also of other toxins.

Danby may want to develop a hamlet in the near future. Knowledge of where our water resources are placed is absolutely crucial to that kind of development, both residential and industrial. In order for any hamlet plan to proceed, we would need to know the quality and location of the ground water, and so we are proceeding with the aquifer study.

There is a task force that meets regularly in Danby to look at land use and to help us apply for strategic planning grants. The task force is made up of a variety (about twelve regularly attend the meetings) of members. They are tackling the questions raised in our zoning public meetings, regarding what density of development the people of Danby want.

In addition, the task force is trying to make land use a more user-friendly issue, so that Danby residents can develop educated opinions about what they want to do with the land. The larger question of the 60/40 designation will need a public hearing to change, and this hearing is scheduled for the first part of 2007.

The Town Board, the water district, the highway and fire department members, and various town staff have been taking classes to comply with new FEMA regulations, and to develop a common language that will enable them to work together in an emergency.

In order for a town to accept FEMA money for emergency preparedness, it needs to show that its residents understand the process. There is a testing process, and certification to follow.

Hurricane Katrina demonstrated that a top-down system was not the best approach, and that local people need to be on-board and consulted in the planning process. If the emergency services, the Town Board, and the volunteer Fire Department are communicating regularly, they can work much more efficiently as a team when the need arises. A lot of work in Danby is going into this and the spin-offs are very positive.

We meet once a month, and our goal is a disaster plan that works for Danby. Most of our previous disasters have been related to snow or ice. We would like to be prepared and to know the location of our shelters, generators, and trained responders.

One of the exciting things about this emergency planning is that people are stepping forward with so much positive energy, and volunteering to help their community. It is what our community can be proud of.

We may also want to develop an alternative communication system for Danby. One of our biggest concerns will be lack of communication resulting from the loss of traditional means (phone, cell phone and computer), and this will involve the same assessment of community resources as mentioned above.

This is clearly going to be an important year in the development of Danby, and I hope to share more of our work and plans with you in a future update. ♣

DSL INTERNET SERVICE IN SOUTHERN DANBY

Ronda Roaring has found that DSL service will soon be available to Frontier Communications customers in southern Danby. Frontier provides telephone service in a region of Tioga County, south of Danby, that includes the Town of Spencer.

According to Ronda's source, "Frontier will be installing several boxes at the intersection of Hart and Crumtown roads...by the first or second quarter of 2007." Although this location is in Tioga County, a Frontier spokesperson confirmed that it serves approximately forty households in Tompkins County.

DSL service requires no additional outside wiring, but a simple signal splitter must be installed where the telephone service enters a house, or signal filters can be installed on each telephone.

Ronda notes that, "You could probably push this project along, especially if you want to take advantage of this service, by calling Carl Berdzinski [the Frontier engineer for this region] at his Norwich office. The number is 607.336.4048. The more people he knows are interested in signing up, the better."

This project does not provide Internet service to Verizon customers, nor does it extend Frontier's service area to include additional Danby residents. ❁

FULL PLATE FARMS

Spinach, tomatoes, eggplants, carrots, acorn squash, onions, garlic, lettuce, kale, collards, beets, potatoes, and fresh flowers. January might not *seem* like the logical time to think about buying fresh, local produce but, in fact, this is just the time to think ahead to next summer's bounty. Seed catalogues and arriving, and this is a good time to support some of our local farmers by signing up for a share of a CSA.

CSA is shorthand for Community Supported Agriculture. CSA activities build symbiotic relationships between local farmers and families by doing away with the "middle man." Farmers find reliable outlets for their produce, and local shoppers find fresh food at a price they can afford, food they can trust to be free of toxins and to be grown in ways that support rather than deplete the environment.

The *Full Plate Farm Collective* includes three farms growing produce for the local community. Two of them are located in Danby: *Three Swallows* farm on Nelson Road and *Remembrance Farm* run by Nathaniel Thompson. *Three Swallows* and *Stick and Stone* farm (1605 Trumansburg Road, two miles north of the hospital) are weekly pickup sites.

The three farms grow over 40 acres of vegetables including salad greens, garlic, strawberries, tomatoes, squash, beets, eggplants, carrots, onions, and peppers. All farms are certified organic, and two of the farms are biodynamic. By cooperating, the farms can ensure variety, quality, and quantity.

Full Plate had 260 members during the 2006 growing season. New members are welcome to join at any time, and early subscribers (winter signups) are eligible for a partial discount.

Shareholders have a weekly opportunity—June through November—to fill a large bag with seasonal produce of their choice and the opportunity to pick their own from crops including herbs, flowers, peas, and cherry tomatos.

Weekly newsletters inform members about farm happenings and also include information about unusual or heirloom varieties of fruit and vegetables. Helpful and tasty recipes inspire cooks with new ways to use bountiful amounts of produce. Full Plate also reaches out to the community by presenting cooking classes, making subsidized shares available, and donating excess produce to local food pantries.
