HIGHWAY DEP'T UPDATE

I am returning to work on a limited basis after taking a leave of absence due to health issues. Carl Seamon, the deputy superintendent, has done an outstanding job of keeping the department organized and operational while I've been gone. Carl has done a good job of managing highway crew activities so I have asked him to continue in this role. I will be working on administrative activities such as preparing the work plan for upcoming summer road maintenance, negotiating with contractors on equipment and materials, and bringing the highway remediation project to a close.

Our administrative assistant, Tracy White, has become an invaluable member of the team. Tracy brought several years of highway experience with her from the Virginia Department of Transportation. During her first year with the department, she has quickly learned how to work with state and federal officials. She has facilitated over \$25,000 in FEMA aid and has worked to ensure that we receive over \$90,000 in highway improvement funds from the state. She manages all this while juggling the paperwork that comes into the office every day!

Due to the mild weather earlier this winter, the crew has been able to spend time doing important road maintenance. Activities have included ditching along East Miller, Durfee Hill, and Gunderman Roads, as well as installing snow fence on Nelson, Banks, Bruce Hill, and East Miller. As weather permits, the crew will also be working on prepping roads for spring reconstruction and doing ditch maintenance in West Danby.

I would especially like to thank our highway crew, Gary Hollenbeck, Kent McNeil, Dave Noteboom, Carl Seamon, Jim Seeley and Jeff Ward for their ongoing commitment to keeping our roads safe and sound.

Danby Town History

After the annual meeting of the West Danby Community Association on January 13, Wayne Myers of Michigan Hollow Road and Kathy Clements of Comfort Road presented an informative program and slide presentation, *The Former Bald Hill Road Neighborhood*.

Kathy's ancestors, the Slighters and Loomis, and Wayne's, the Parshalls, lived and farmed on Bald Hill. Kathy and Wayne had many photographs accompanied by interesting and often humorous stories.

One historical event mentioned that evening was a major fire that occurred on Bald Hill. The following account is from the *Ithaca Journal* in the late 1920s (unfortunately, the actual date is not known).

FIRE RACES THRU TOMPKINS WOODS IN DANBY SECTION

Volunteers Fight Blaze Along Two-Mile Front, But Are Unable to Stem Advance 2,000 Acres Burned Over

ITHACA—Along a two-mile front extending from West Danby village over the top of Bald Hill to the Danby-Spencer road a forest fire was raging so hotly Tuesday night that the tired force of less than 100 volunteers, working under Fire Marshall Howard R. Wilbur, was unable to do more than attempt to flank the fire and turn the two ends in by means of backfires and trenches.

Valuable Timber Destroyed

Starting in tinder-dry underbrush on the Dorothy Slighter farm about 10 o'clock Tuesday morning, the blaze had burned over 2,000 acres to the Sweazey farm by 6 o'clock, destroying, in addition to a valuable stand of young timber, a large acreage of young pines on the Slighter property. Only the absence of a strong wind during the day prevented the fire from sweeping thru the wooded section that extends to the Pennsylvania line.

After dark the fire cast a lurid glow in the sky, and from West Danby village the glowing embers of the fire- swept acreage lay like the many lights of a great city into the darkness, while to the south a straight wall of fire, so straight as to suggest a line drawn, was eating its way along the wooded area, consuming everything in its path.

Farmers Anxious

Taking the narrow dirt road that leads east over Bald Hill from West Danby, observers were able to skirt the fire, the smoke sweeping the other way, but the climb, straight up it seemed, to the clouds, and apparently endless, was no longer than that wall of fire which a worn but, exhausted little force of farmers and villagers still was fighting, faces black and begrimed with heat and sweat.

Along the Danby heights road to North Spencer the occupants of six or eight farmhouses were anxious while watching the progress of the flames down the east side and over the top of Bald Hill at 9 o'clock Tuesday night. They were huddled in little silent groups on porches waiting to make a decision as to whether or not their buildings would be threatened.

About 8:30 o'clock the dreaded breeze sprang up briskly, bringing with it just a hint of rain, but far from enough moisture to dampen the powdery leaves and underbrush.

More Volunteers Called

Opinion was divided as to whether the blaze started from careless hunters or the railroad at the foot of Bald Hill on the West Danby side. From a small beginning it swept straight southeast along the Bald Hill ridge, leaving behind a blackened, charred and smoking area.

A hurry call for more volunteers took about every ablebodied man and boy in the Danby village after supper and permitted the men who had been fighting the flames all day to stagger out for supper and a brief rest. Tuesday night they were going back in, carrying bread, cheese and other edibles from the neighboring stores, prepared to make a night of it.

So far as could be learned at a late hour, no buildings had been burned or any of the fighters injured. Unless rain comes to help, it will require a larger force Wednesday to get the fire under control.

Inscribed on the front of the article is, "This was last Tuesday the 10th, all out now."
