The Aquifer Study group will be meeting with the USGS and the County on project status for well drilling: site placement and drilling information. We will update the public when we learn more.

We are in the last stages of the highway remediation project; the Board will review the EPA closure report when it comes in from engineers.

The Danby Emergency Management (Town Board, highway and fire departments) committee meets monthly, and Frank Proto and I are available to meet the public, on the Tuesday following Board meetings, 10:30am at the Town Hall.

I am looking forward to seeing the first flowering of the bulbs and shrubs that were planted all over the Town of Danby last fall!

DANBY TOWN HISTORY

In 1872, Danby had approximately 16 one-room school houses. This is a list of rules that applied to that time.

1872 RULES FOR TEACHERS

- 1. Teachers each day will fill lamps, clean chimneys.
- 2. Each teacher will bring a bucket of water and a scuttle of coal for the day's session.
- 3. Make your pens carefully. You may whittle nibs to the individual taste of the pupils.
- 4. Men teachers may take one evening each week for courting purposes, or two evenings if they go to church regularly.
- 5. After ten hours in school, the teacher may spend the remaining time reading the Bible or other good books.
- 6. Women teachers who marry or engage in unseemly conduct will be dismissed.

- 8. Any teacher who smokes, uses liquor in any form, frequents pool or public halls or gets shaved in a barber shop will give good reason to suspect his worth, intention, integrity and honesty.
- 9. The teacher who performs his labor faithfully and without fault for five years will be given an increase of twenty-five cents per week in his pay, providing the Board of Education approves.

These responsibilities were on top of their teaching and discipline duties. Teachers had to be dedicated to their profession to endure.
