DANBY TOWN HISTORY

In the spring and the fall I go to the *Friends of the Library* book sale on Esty Street in search of books or pamphlets that contain local history, with occasional success. Most recently I found two *Crossroads Comments*, by Lois O'Connor.

Lois wrote a weekly column, during the summer months, for the *Ithaca Journal*. Her "journey" stories were about Tompkins County and the Finger Lakes Region. One that I found to be most fascinating was written about West Danby.

Spices in the September Air—September 15, 1950

The pungent fragrance of pickling spices drifts through the September air these days as background for chats about crops, canning and visits to the various fairs.

A light mist was falling as I wound out the Inlet Valley Road toward West Danby. Gay splashes of orange caught by eye at the Inlet Valley Market where bunches of bittersweet were being hung, and further on by SunnYGables a stretch of winter wheat was emerald green a-shimmer in the silver mist.

The sign post pointing to Newfield Depot Road made me digress for a bit to see the tiny settlement formerly known as Nina.

The old rocker in the home of Mrs. Roy Albright and her daughter, Jean, was so comfortable and the stop was so pleasant that time slipped away very fast.

At one time there were three passenger trains a day each way and two freights that stopped at Newfield Depot. Now one freight and one express go through and it is expected that the station will be closed shortly. There is no station agent. Mrs. Frank Kippola acts as caretaker.

Jean Albright, who majored in dairy cattle at Cornell, now raises sheep exclusively. She has 75 Shropshires and they were picturesquely grouped over the rolling hillside beyond the house.

Back in the orchard on the Albright farm are the graves of a mother and child. The inscription on the stone reads, "Margaret, wife of Charles Nichols, died August 18, 1852, aged 76 years, 8 months, 26 days."

Mrs. Maude Perry lives in West Danby. Her grandmother, Lamira Truesdale Tupper, came into the area in

1866 from Rush, Pennsylvania by ox-team. Mrs. Perry is still using her grandmother's sewing basket of woven rush which is in perfect condition.

There were five children in that pioneer Tupper family and on the journey 16-year-old Minnie was given the responsibility of looking out for a satchel that contained all of the family money—enough to buy a farm and more. One night as they made ready to stay overnight at a farm house it was discovered that Minnie had left the satchel on the wagon. It was fortunately recovered but from then on father Tupper took over guardianship of the family treasure.

One delightful story that has come down in the Tupper family is about Mrs. Perry's great-grandfather who was a body-guard for George Washington. Once when Washington was stopping in the home of his attendant, he fell into conversation with one of the little girls and they came to the point of argument. Goaded beyond politeness she burst out with "George Washington, you're a liar." Her mother firmly took her by the arm but as they started from the room, Washington stopped them.

"No, don't punish her," he said. "If an adult leads a child on by teasing, the child is not at fault. The fault is mine."

Danby Fire Department Expansion Approved

Following a public hearing on May 17, the Planning Board granted conditional approval for the proposed expansion of the Danby Fire Department building on Danby Road. The project still requires approval from the NYS Dep't of Transportation (for an expanded apron and parking area) and a variance from the Danby Board of Zoning Appeals (for a 5-foot encroachment on the required rear yard setback).

The expansion will add space on three sides of the existing building (all but the street side) and reconfigure the internal spaces. Two new truck bays will be on the left as you face the building and a new meeting room on the right. Full architectural drawings are still being prepared for public review.

JENNINGS POND!

Jennings Pond clean-up days are slated for Saturday, June 16 and Sunday June 17. The pond is expected to open for the season on Saturday, June 23 and continue to operate through Labor Day in September.

If you're new to Danby or are not familiar with Jennings Pond, the pond is a part of Buttermilk Falls State Park. The Town of Danby contracts with the NYS Parks Department to run Jennings Pond as a fully operational State Park. Before opening each year, Jennings Pond goes through strict procedures involving the Department of Environmental Health and New York State.

Tests are done on a weekly basis to ensure the health quality of the water. We have tested better than Treman and Buttermilk!

Because the town contracts with NY State, the pond clean up by volunteers is essential. This requires the physical dredging of the pond weed, the layout of the swim lines, and general clean up.

For your swimming pleasure and safety, certified life-guards are on duty, seven days a week. BBQ pits and picnic tables are on site.

Perhaps, Frontier's relatively small size (compared to the phone service provider for the rest of Danby, which happily advertises DSL and FIOS with the monthly bill, but doesn't provide them) enables them to keep up with current technology. ❁

QUALIFY FOR FOOD STAMPS?

The Nutrition Outreach and Education Program (NOEP) provides free, confidential prescreenings to determine potential Food Stamp eligibility. NOEP takes pride in making the process as easy as possible by explaining food stamp terms and the application process, providing a DSS application and help to complete it, answering food stamp questions, providing referrals to other resources such as food pantries, and by contacting DSS if any problems arise on your behalf.

Tentative Eligibility can be initially determined by the monthly gross income limit and the resource limit. A free, confidential, 15-minute prescreening over the phone or in person with a NOEP representative is all it takes to determine if you may be eligible for food stamps.

Monthly Gross Income Limit

There is no maximum gross income limit for households with an elderly person (60+) or disabled member. Child support being paid is not included in your gross income. Income includes pay from work, pension, child support

received, social security, disability, workman's compensation, etc. The gross income limits may change every October, and this chart is accurate until September 30, 2007.

Resource Limit

A Household is allowed up to \$2,000 in savings (\$3,000 if a member is 60+ or disabled.) This includes IRAs, bank accounts, cash, stocks, bonds, or real estate. Non-refundable burial funds are not counted in this. Refundable burial funds are counted as resources. The home you live in is not considered a resource. A lien will *not* be placed on your house or car if you enroll for food stamps.

According to Pat Caveney, the next stage in the process will be to seek public comment on the specific plans for the building before a referendum to approve the funding. The projected cost is in the neighborhood of \$800,000.

White Hawk Ecovillage Inches Forward

Work on the main access road for White Hawk Ecovillage is beginning. The Town Board and Planning Board concurred that, despite site plan approval not yet being finalized, there is no legal impediment to doing so.

At least a primitive access road is needed to reach the site, nearly 1500 feet back from Danby Road, across from Dobson Enterprises. Access is needed for test well drilling and preliminary site work.

The Planning Board expects to hold a final public hearing about White Hawk in June.

Planning Board Seeks Lead Agency Status

At its May meeting, the Planning Board voted to request the Town Board to make that it the lead agency in Hamlet Planning. Lead agency status would place the Planning Board in charge of the process, to conduct it as it sees fit.

The Planning Board proposes to conduct the Hamlet Planning in a manner similar its work on the Compre-

hensive Plan. In that process, members of the Planning Board were each assigned primary responsibility for topics, to gather data and write the corresponding sections of the plan. For the Hamlet Planning, this will likely mean the creation of subcommittees to maximize public involvement. This proposal will now go to the Town Board for consideration in June.

The Town Board had asked the Planning Board to review the status of implementation of the Comprehensive Plan. The Planning Board is reviewing key documents including including the Comprehensive Plan itself, a report on historical and natural resources, and the Pendall Report (about growth patterns in Danby, prepared by a Cornell class). A discussion of those documents and how they might be used in hamlet planning is scheduled for next month's Planning Board meeting.

Town Board Defers Subdivision Regulations

The Danby Town Board held a public hearing on proposed changes to the Subdivision Regulations. A handful of the public was present, but two of the commenters had extensive suggestions.

The Board opted to study them for consideration at its next meeting. If the Board opts to incorporate substantive changes, a new public hearing will need to be conducted before the amended regulations can be enacted into law. Otherwise, the Board could act to enact the proposed regulations at its next meeting. ❀
