DCC Movie Night

Slawomir Grünberg's 2005 documentary,*Borderline: The People vs. Eunice Baker*, will be screened in the Danby Town Hall at 7pm on Saturday, November 17. The screening is sponsored by the Danby Community Council. It's free and popcorn will be served.

Danby resident Grünberg is an Emmy Award-winning documentary producer, director, cameraman, and editor born in Lublin, Poland. A graduate of the Polish Film School in Lodz, he emigrated to the US in 1981; since then he has directed and produced over 40 television documentaries, winning numerous national and international awards. Grunberg founded Log In Productions, a professional film and video production company, in Danby in 1987.

Borderline, which aired on public television stations, tells the story of Eunice Baker, a borderline mentally retarded woman who was sentenced to 15 years to life in prison for murdering a child she baby-sat, despite evidence that the death was accidental. After nearly five years in prison, the New York State Appellate Court reduced the charge to criminally negligent homicide, and Baker was released in 2004 on time served.

By following this controversy as it unfolds in the Owego courtroom, *Borderline* draws attention to the problem of mentally handicapped individuals charged with crime, and provides insight into a tragic case in our neighboring community.

Supervisor's Town News

This has been a very busy month for the Town of Danby. Requirements for Town Government have been made much more complicated and I recently completed 40 hours of training in order to keep Danby compliant with these new regulations. As a result, the Town is now eligible for FEMA money in case of a natural disaster.

The Council of Governments has been formed, with membership including County Legislators, Town Supervisors, and Staff. We have been working hard during the past two years to develop this council. We have created the Recreation Partnership, a program for Tompkins County children that offers sports, theater, and community development skills; the Town of Danby recently signed this agreement.

Our current project is self-insurance for municipalities, with the potential to save millions of dollars. We realized that the biggest cost to towns is health insurance, so we said, "Let's become self insured."

We have received a grant to help us do this and the plan is now on the table in Albany and will be presented by Assemblywoman Barbara Lifton.

The SPCA is running a deficit and has doubled the fees to all towns in order for us to use their services. The town is meeting in emergency session to formulate a response to this new development.

There is a lot happening -- outside our borders -- that affects our Town of Danby we must make time to effectively meet with other elected officials. Cooperation between elected bodies will be essential for the future of our town. There is still much to do.
