Tax Collection

Town of Danby tax collection begins on January 2, 2008; the Town Clerk/Tax Collector's hours are Tuesday–Friday, 9am–4pm, and Saturdays, 9am–Noon. Checks should be payable to, "Town Of Danby Tax Collector."

Option A - Full Payment: *Total Taxes may be paid on or before January 31*, without additional charges. Interest equal to 1% of the unpaid balance will be added to your total on the first day of each month through March 31. Upon the return of unpaid taxes made by the tax collector to Tompkins County on April 1, a penalty of five 5% will be added, plus interest at the rate of 1% per month calculated from February 1.

Option B - Installment: Your first installment payment to the tax collector must be postmarked on or before January 31. Payment of the service charge for this option must be included at this time. This option is not available after January 31. To avoid penalty and interest, the second installment must be paid on or before July 3. If paying the second installment by mail, make the check payable to, "Tompkins County." Unpaid installments after July 3 will be charged a penalty of 5% plus interest from July 3 at 1% per month.

I slip and slide downtown to get supplies. All the stores have signs saying, "Out of batteries, lamp oil, generators, food".

At least I can head back home with some anchovies.

I can't find my house because I never put up those 4-inch address numbers required by the State. I land upside-down in a ditch. I call 9-1-1. Thank goodness my cell phone is charged, because I still haven't bought a cell phone charger to use in the car.

I give 9-1-1 my location, and after a while I see a County Sheriff's car and a Danby Fire Department truck pass me. They can't find me for a while, because none of my neighbors have those 4-inch address numbers either.

Finally, a kindly man on a snowmobile happens by, and helps me out of the ditch and back to my house. Hey, I've met a true neighbor!

Let's hope Danby never has such severe storms as the mid-west. But, as the Danby Emergency Management Planning Committee has recommended in many past articles, please "Be Ready".

- Make sure your household is stocked with emergency supplies.
- Meet your neighbors and make arrangements to help each other in emergencies.
- Get those 4-inch address numbers installed (see separate article).
- Complete the Disaster Response Survey if you have not already; available on the Town website, [town.danby.ny.us], or at the Town Clerk's office at Town Hall. The Survey is confidential, for use only by emergency responders.

Can We Find You?

If you have an emergency at your home and need to call for police, medical or fire personnel, can these responders easily find your house?

Surprisingly, many residences in the Danby Fire District—addresses in Brooktondale, Danby, Ithaca, Spencer, West Danby, and Willseyville—are difficult to spot because they are poorly marked. If an address is difficult to find in the daylight, how much more difficult it might be to find during night time? This difficulty translates to lost minutes in coming to your aid. Please take time today to make sure your house numbers are clearly visible from the road.

For best visibility, we ask that all numbers be a minimum of 4" tall. This is required by code in the Town of Danby. Numbers on mailboxes should be visible from both directions along the road. This may mean affixing numbers on both sides of your mailbox. Residents of apartments, duplexes, town houses, or other complexes should make sure their house numbers can be distinguished from others. Please replace any deteriorating or faded numbers. If necessary, remove overgrown vegetation.

Numbers are sold in most hardware stores.

The Danby Volunteer Fire Company is sponsoring a sale of address number signs. They are designed to be placed along the road in front of your house, preferably near your driveway entrance. These number signs are becoming more popular and can be seen in surrounding towns. The custom-made signs have 4" tall white numbers on a green metal reflective vinyl background; the standard sign size is 6" x 18". Up to five digits are printed on both sides of the sign. You decide whether you want the numbers to read horizontally or vertically.

Each set of numbers costs \$12. For an additional \$5, they can be mounted on a metal support post, which includes mounting hardware. Without the post, you will need to mount the numbers yourself utilizing the pre-drilled holes in the sign corners. Fire company members will assist anyone who needs help setting up these number signs.
