Ithaca filmmaker Gossa Tsegaye will screen his latest documentary *The Jungle's Edge* at 7pm on Saturday, March 15, in Danby Town Hall. The half-hour film chronicles daily life in the Jungle, a wooded area near Cayuga Lake Inlet that for decades has served as a home for the homeless.

Gossa filmed *The Jungle's Edge* over a two-year period with local resident David Fogel. Sponsored by Danby Community Council, the screening and fresh-popped popcorn are free.

Gossa has produced several documentaries on marginalized groups in Tompkins County, including *Dream Street*, about residents of the Buffalo Hill Road area in Caroline, and *The Dividing Line*, about Ithaca's West End. He has produced more than 75 films, many telecasts for public access and PBS, and has won numerous awards.

Gossa was born and raised in Ethiopia and came to the US at age 17. His first home in Ithaca was on East Miller Road in Danby. He was graduated by Ithaca High School in 1972, Ithaca College in 1976, and Cornell University in 1984. He teaches at Ithaca College, where he is president of the Faculty Council, and lives on Cleveland Avenue with his wife Elizabeth and daughter Nile.

Danby Town History

Beginning in 1907, and continuing for 24 years, Dewitt Traver kept detailed diaries of life in South Danby. Mr. Traver died on Sep 29th, 1932 residing for over 79 years in the Town of Danby. His diaries are fascinating glimpses of a bygone era. I think you'll enjoy these entries from the year 1908.

Wed Jan 1- Ed and I cut wood, Fred drawen out. Came by the Eddie Dorn place, they are putten a slate roof on their new house.

Thu Jan 2- Ed and I cutten trees in the lot on the Ward place, Fred drawen them out with the oxen.

Mon Jan 6- Buy a hog of Jerry Dorn and butcher it weight 205 lbs. Price 6 cents a lb. Fred has 101 lbs. of it.

Wed Jan 22- Go to E.B. Millers after stump machine I bought of him price \$10.

Thu Jan 23- Cutten logs walk over to Charley Mannings to buy his oxen. I offer him \$100.00 if he would throw in the yoke, he wouldn't do it asks \$150 for them.

Wed Jan 29- Go over to Ridgeways to look at a yoke of oxen. Gets very cold.

Mon Feb 3- Go up to Arran Pilots to look at yoke of oxen. Gets very cold. Mail don't come.

Tue Feb 11- Go out to George Boyheats to look at a yoke of oxen.

Wed Feb 12- Buy a yoke of oxen of Charles Manning. Price \$150.

Thu Feb 13- Hoskins moves in on the Wright place. (Nora Younglove tells me this Hoskins used to raise all different kinds of rabbits, she use to like to stop on her way to and from school to see the rabbits.)

Sat Feb 15- Make a yoke for the oxen, first one I ever made. Wed Feb 19- We draw the big oak with the ox team, something I never done before.

Thu Mar 19- Down to Waymans vendue (auction), bought 2 milk cans paid \$2.75.

Tue Mar 24- To Fred Banfields vendue bought a cow for Fred price \$29.75.

Thu Apr 2- Rented the Molissie house to C. Manly for \$25 a year.

Fri Apr 10- To Spencer bought grass seed, timothy \$3.00, clover \$14 per bushel.

Thu Apr 16- To Candor bought 200 rods of wire fence, 6 wire price 20 cents.

Mon May 18- Ship the saws to Emmersons Mill and Co., Beaver Falls, P.A. Buy a circular saw of T.S. Ward price \$10. Sun May 31- Lamb killed last night by dogs, this makes 7 this year killed.

Wed Jun 3- Frost this morning.

Tue Jun 9- Fred gets new Syracuse plow, price \$10.

Mon Jun 15- To Spencer get the saws I sent off to have repaired, cost \$38.22. Rain a little.

Sun Jun 21- Go out to the cemetery, Amana Genung buried.

Sat Jun 27- To Willseyville after 1 1/2 ton of phosphate bought of M.L. Hill price \$15 a ton.

Sat Jul 11- Let the bank have my note for \$100 due in 6 months.

Sat Jul 18- Thunder shower rains hard Mark Hill killed by litning about 5:00. (Norma Younglove told me he stood in the door way of the barn when this happened.)

Fri Sep 11- Albert Smith and wife here to dinner, they are from California.

Sat Sep 19- Bought a iron wagon of Jim McFall price \$40.

Thu Sep 24- Contracted of Lew Cummings 30 acres of land west of the house here on the hill price \$250.

Mon Oct 26- John Manley died this morning.

Tue Oct 27- Pay Lew Cummings \$250 for 30 acres of land west of the house on the hill and get deed.

Fri Oct 30- To Mark Hills vendue. A cold day.

Thu Nov 12- Let Charley Bruce have comb homey 44 lbs., strained 26 lbs. Price \$5.60.

Mon Dec 6- Walk over to Charley Ostranders in Michigan Hollow to look at a pair of steers.

Thu Dec 31- Cut a big chestnut tree up west of the house. Gets cold, no snow this winter yet.

Dewitt Traver is the grandfather of Kenneth Traver of South Danby Road, who so generously shared his grandfather's diaries. In 1977 Ken's wife, Lois, chose the most interesting excerpts and presented them to her husband as a gift. Ken Traver is thought of by many as the unofficial Mayor of South Danby, the senior gentleman of our South Danby's history.

TC Legislature Report

As you might suspect the County is anticipating a challenging budget season, particularly with Governor Spitzer's proposed draft and its unknown actual impact on County departments and services. Departments have been asked to estimate the impact, assuming that his budget is passed. Even without feedback from the agencies,we're guessing at a loss of over a half-million dollars.

Don't miss the deadlines for filing your property exemptions. Call the Assessment Department (607.274.5517) if you're not sure. Also, agricultural exemptions are due by April 1! Remember to set up a time to talk to the assessor if you want to discuss your new assessment. Grievance days provide another opportunity to review paperwork, though those dates have not yet been confirmed. Formal reviews will be in May.

I chair the Legislature's Health and Human Services Committee, and serve on the Planning, Development, and Environmental Quality Committee. The issues currently addressed by these committees include the Health Department's fee structure, water well siting program, a new water and sewer survey through Tompkins County Area Development, Lake Source Monitoring Program, flood hazard mitigation projects, affordable housing, and adjustments to the ag district.

At the request of many constituents, and with Senator Schumer's help, the impact of large waste hauling vehicles passing through our towns is being addressed.

Each Town has secured an additional \$1,000 through the County, to apply towards Community Library services. This should help to offset some unanticipated expenses.

Ridership on the TCAT bus routes has increased, logging over 3 million riders Countywide for the second year in a row!

This month, the Town Board listened to a presentation by the Danby Community Park Association which is working to establish a park across the street from the Town Hall. Currently, they are planning to build ball fields for the Babe Ruth League/Cal Ripkin Division. Plans for the

future include a Community Center.

The Town of Danby is working with other municipalities in Tompkins County regarding our future S.P.C.A. contract and we are meeting on our own to talk to them about the quality of service they provide for our town.

In other business, we are in the process of installing backup generators for the West Danby water district.

Highway Secretary Laura Shawley reported that the Highway Superintendent has hired two new employees and that the paperwork has been filed for the grant that paid for the East Miller Road repairs.

Susan Beeners is working on a Request for Proposal for smoke detectors for the Town Hall. These detectors will be connected to the County Dispatch Center. When an appropriate bid is chosen, the matter will be discussed

at a public hearing.

We have lost a number of "old timers" lately and, without mentioning them by name, many have been saddened by their passing. They gave a lot of their time to the community, their children grew up and went to school together, and some of them sat on our boards and served us in many ways. YES, THE TEEN-EMPLOYER Connection

Are you a Danby teen looking for a part time job? Or are you a resident needing occasional yard help or a babysitter? Tompkins County's Youth Employment Service (YES) is a free, friendly job referral network to match teens aged 14-19 with part-time or short-term work. Housed at the Ithaca Youth Bureau, it is staffed by professionals who advise young people and employers.

Employers: YES will ask you details to get an idea of your needs. YES can refer teens who are interested in working, have been pre-screened by the staff, and have developed an employment record with YES. Babysitters must meet YES requirements and receive YES approval.
