Town Clerk's Desktop

One of the things I like very much about Danby is that, as a community, we have a healthy small-town informality. The discussions held in our town meetings are often informal, allowing citizens to offer opinions in an open and frank dialogue. The atmosphere of our Town offices is relaxed and friendly. When people come to Town Hall, they are greeted as friends and neighbors whether they've lived here all of their lives or are new arrivals to our town. I enjoy working this way.



But, occasionally, formality is required in this work. The Seal of the Town Clerk, when it appears on an official Town document, is one of the symbols of appropriate formality. The official Seal of the Town Clerk is used, primarily, on two types of documents: marriage certificates and certified resolutions.

Resolutions are the formal actions of a municipal body—the Town Board, Planning Board, or Board of Zoning

Appeals. Some resolutions impact residents directly, such as those regarding special permits or requests for a variance of local zoning rules. Some resolutions, such as the approval of minutes and appointing members of boards and committees, are simply, "Taking care of business."

Other resolutions have larger political implications; they are the voice of the Town regarding pending State and Federal legislation. There are also resolutions regarding potential legal action by the Town, such as in Code Enforcement. Recent examples include an action regarding a property on East Miller Road, a resolution urging the NYS DEC to reconsider the draft NYS DEC Supplemental Generic Environmental Impact Statement, resolutions that adopt local laws, and even a resolution in support of a resolution (!) by the Tompkins County Council of Governments linking a possible statewide tax cap to needed relief from unfunded mandates. The wording of each of these resolutions can be found in the minutes of Town Board meetings from the past few months.

These resolutions become Certified Resolutions. The text of the resolution is printed, preferably on Town letterhead, along with the results of the roll call vote. At the bottom of the Certified Resolution, the Town Clerk states that s/he, "...does hereby certify that the forgoing resolution is a true and exact copy of a resolution duly adopted by the Town Board of said Town

of Danby." The date of the meeting is included, along with my signature, the date of certification, and the words, "In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and the Seal of the Town of Danby." The seal's raised imprint makes the Certified Resolution legal and official. You can't get much more formal than that.

As a reminder, office hours for the Town Clerk have changed to better reflect the residents needs and requirements at Town Hall. New Hours are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday 10am-5pm and Saturdays 10am-Noon. The Town Clerk's office will be closed Sundays and Thursdays. And yes, the chocolate kiss bowl remains full. Come in and say, "Hi!"

GAS DRILLING TASK FORCE

Danby's Gas Drilling Task Force (GDTF) continues its work of learning about potential positive and negative impacts of high-volume gas drilling in the Danby area, considering how negative impacts could be managed and minimized, and planning educational forums that are open to the public.

On March 23, the group heard a presentation by Michael Dineen, a member of the Concerned Citizens of Ulysses. The door-to-door petition drive done by this group revealed that 80% of those approached (over 1,300 people) supported a ban in the Town of Ulysses on drilling for natural gas using slickwater horizontal hydrofracturing. The GDTF is beginning work on designing a representative survey to learn about the views of Danby residents on shale gas extraction and possible Town responses. A number of Task Force members have expressed interest in designing and conducting a door-to-door survey. The Town Board, during its March 14 meeting, approved the GDTF idea of conducting a survey, but asked to see the survey questions before endorsing the process.

The Danby Town Board also approved a resolution drafted by the GDTF, seeking reconsideration of the Department of Environmental Conservation's Draft Supplemental Generic Environmental Impact Statement. The resolution reminds the DEC that we feel it is very important to address, "the crucial issues of managing wastewater and cumulative effects of shale gas extraction," and also requests a role for a citizens' advisory committee. The resolution will be sent to all of our NYS government representatives, and it's online on the Town of Danby web site, [town.danby.ny.us/TownBoard].

Jennifer Tiffany will speak as the GDTF representative at

the Town Wide Meeting at 7pm, April 7, in Town Hall. This meeting is intended to provide an information exchange about issues facing Danby and the work currently being done by a dozen or so Town committees and civic groups. The meeting will involve short presentations by each group. The public is invited to attend and learn more about the projects people are working on in Danby.

The public is welcome to attend and participate in GDTF meetings. The next meetings are planned for Wednesday, April 13 and April 27, in the Danby Town Hall at 7pm.

A SURVEY ON GAS DRILLING

The Danby Gas Drilling Task Force is preparing a representative survey of town residents, to gauge local feeling about gas drilling and to suggest what actions the Town Board might take. We are just

starting to draft the survey; we are looking for volunteers to help come up with the questions, and to help out by going door-to-door.

Various communities— Pittsburgh and Buffalo are among the larger ones—have passed bans on hydraulic fracturing for shale gas extraction, others—the Canadian province of Quebec, for example—



have passed long-term moratoriums while the issue is studied. The state of New Jersey is considering a ban, as are various small towns in NY. Others are considering zoning changes to prohibit "high impact industry" in general. We need to consider what we want our community to look like in the future and what strategies will help us get there.

The Danby Land Bank, the Food Pantry, Unique Natural Areas, Gas Task Force. What projects are they working on?

The Town is thinking about new laws that will govern the use of its roads by large or heavy vehicles; perhaps by imposing weight limits, seasonal use limits, and even requiring a bond before usage permits will be issued.

How does all of this affect residents? It is important for all of us in many ways. Learn more at the Town Wide Meeting.

Come hear and meet our various groups, hear about the projects in place, and become a part of the dialogue.

In mid-April, the NYS DEC will be holding a hearing about its proposed plan ("Rapid Waters") for the use of the Danby State Forest; that is, for the use of about 25% of the Town of Danby. Do you know what they are proposing? Does it matter to you what goes on in our State Forest?

I do believe that there are some, among you, who have an interest, pro or con, in the prospect of Gas Drilling coming to our Town. I would be interested to hear what you think. In the time we have before some form of this new industry manifests itself, I would encourage all of us to become involved in the process.

There are endeavors taking place in Ulysses and Dryden (among other localities) to ban this sort of activity. What effect would this have for our residents?

It is important for all of us to be able to comment on the projects we are presently engaged with, listen to reactions, be clear and transparent in our work, and advocate for areas of concern.

Ordinance will be heard at 7pm on Monday, April 4, as a part of the Town Board meeting.

The proposed amendment will substitute the word "may" for "shall", allowing the Town Board to make appointments, but without requiring them. Additional changes make typographical and numbering corrections to the Zoning Ordinance.

DANBY STATE FOREST MGMT PLAN

The NYS DEC has prepared a draft management plan for its *Rapid Waters* region, which includes the Danby State Forest. The proposed management plan appears to protect "high-use recreational areas...trails...ecosystems" but does not note any such areas in the Danby Forest. Much of the Danby Forest could be available for development.

A public hearing, originally scheduled for Candor on April 7, will probably be moved to mid-April. Keep an eye out for late-breaking info, and participate with your comments.

LIFE IN DANBY

This month's observations of life in Danby Submitted by Julie Kulik

Quite a celebration of Spring's Migration this month! Thanks to all for your emails and phone calls, keep them coming.

There were several comments on David Howe's Osprey article in the March Danby News, including collaborations on sightings in this area, and a recognition that Ospreys are no longer on the endangered species list, they are "threatened."

Here are some quotes from our Danby neighbors, followed by the species list. See you in the woods!

- "This week I saw the first great horned owl here in years!"
- "For a few minutes on Saturday, a woodcock made about every sound a woodcock can make, over a sloping sloppy snow melt field, right at the point of dusk that's too dark to see a small flying bird."
- "I grew up on Bald Hill Road, near Jennings Pond. That was in the late 40s to mid-60s. My grandparents lived next door and both had a keen interest in nature. My grandfather was an old-time hunter but at the same time was known to bring an opossum into the basement during sub-zero weather to keep its tail from freezing. My grandmother had beautiful flower gardens and loved feeding and identifying birds. They were my mentors and I spent many happy hours with them learning to observe nature.... Those were the carefree days when a kid could leave the house and wander the fields and woods without having to report in every 10 minutes. There were only a few houses in the area at that time; only actively farmed fields with grazing cows and sheep close by. The pond was a favorite spot for my grandmother and me when I was little and later just by myself.
 - As for the osprey, there was an actively nesting pair at the pond in those early years until DDT decimated many of the raptors. I married and moved away in 1966 and there still weren't any osprey at the pond. When my husband and I retired, we returned here in 2000 and built a home on Comfort Road. In the last 10+ years I have seen osprey at the pond though I can't say for sure if they nest there nor when they made a comeback. My son and I have also seen visiting Bald Eagles there. The Bald Hill/Jennings Pond area has changed a lot over the years and it's not the "wild" area that it was in my childhood but that hasn't stopped the osprey from returning!"

Even though Candor's ZIPcode is 13743, some of the census forms were sent to Candor 13734. Well, according to the superintendent of the Candor post office, the ZIPcode takes precedence over the town name

and the postal service is *required* to send mail with incorrect ZIPs to the incorrect post office (where, we hope, the error gets fixed).

I asked her, "If I used the address, 'Danby 14883,' would the mail come to me?" She said it should. I consulted with another post office superintendent, who said the same thing.

I have since run tests, and the mail does, indeed, come to me at "Danby 14883." Such a change won't

help our Town Clerk, who needs to know everyone's zip, but if you like putting "Danby" in your address, give it a try. Send yourself a postcard or an empty en-

velope at "Danby" with and your current ZIPcode. It should work.

A proposal to create a Public Access Comuter Facility in the Danby Town Hall is under consideration by the Town Board.

Many Danby residents are unable to participate in today's online world, thanks to the inconsistent availability (or none at all) of high-speed Internet service in our Town. If they have computers, many are limited to dial-up speeds. Other residents take their computers downtown to wireless hot spots...or are unfamiliar with computer usage.

For those with portable computers, the project would provide public wireless access in Town Hall when the building is open. In addition, several computers would be installed an available for public use. The public network is expected to have 5Mbps download speed. For those new to computers, as well as those with specific questions, some assistance, either on an individual or group basis, will be available.
