



# Town Clerk's Desktop

Oh, cruel January! We barely get over the indulgences of holiday parties and staying up late for New Year's Eve when reality hits us. There is no escape from Cold, Dark, and Taxes. There are days when it seems that massive amounts of chocolate is the only thing that will get us through.

Tax bills are sent out at the very end of December and should be in your mailbox by the first week of January. If, for some reason, you do not receive your Town



and County property tax bill by that week, give us a call. Remember, if your taxes are paid by an escrow service, the original bill is sent to the bank or payment service. If there has been a change in your escrow status and the bill should come to you, let us know. We can print out a duplicate copy at get it to you right away.

The Town tax levy increased this year by 0.813 percent—less than one percent. For every \$100,000 of assessment, an average tax bill will increase \$6 in regards the combined Danby

General, Highway, and Fire District budget. The amount your tax bill will actually increase depends on whether your property value went up, down, or stayed the same following the most recent assessment. Fire protection, water services, and highway maintenance all cost money. Danby is doing the best it can with the least amount possible.

Several calculations contribute to your January Town and County tax bill. Remember that your tax bill includes both Town and County tax levies (along with the Fire District levy and, if you live in West Danby, the levy for the Water District). The Town Board and Fire Districts passed their budgets in November followed, soon after, by the County. Thanks to careful planning and belt-tightening, the Town of Danby was once again able to stay under the 2% tax cap. The County was not able to keep its budget within the tax cap, and this increase will "trickle down" to your local bill.

In order to be as accessible as possible, the Town Clerk's office will be open 10am-5pm Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, and 10am-1pm on Saturdays. We are closed on Sundays and Thursdays.

The first day of tax collection is Wednesday, January 2, as we are closed Dec. 31 and Jan. 1 for the New Years holiday.


Remember, Town Clerks are only tax collectors. We don't set your assessment or your tax rate. I know that there's little I can do to make January better than it is, but I can promise that the candy bowl will be filled with chocolate kisses including plenty of dark chocolate. I look forward to seeing many of you during the cold days of January and February. I can renew or issue dog licenses and answer questions about town government at the same time.

## DECEMBER 2012 PERIODIC REPORT

As we wind down the current year it's important to recognize that certain County challenges were met well, while others, and new ones, loom for 2013.

Though we kept the property tax very manageable for the present, the two items still giving us much consternation are State pension costs and Medicaid. We're looking forward to one more year of increased pension costs, then a leveling out. Medicaid however is anyone's guess right now.

How these effect local programming will be apparent in planning for Youth Services, infrastructure, and mental health, to name a few. While we were able to restore some support for youth development, meetings are planned with all three towns to initiate a direction for our youth that can be sustained.

Health care for those needing support in their homes hit a bump with the Coun-Home Health Care unit closing. However, our local agencies stepped in, and together with the hospital are holding their

own in filling this critical need. The care transitions program is off to a great start!

A continuing challenge will be the newest review of the fracking regulations posed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. We've proposed an extension, but started the review to keep our State folks aware of our concerns.

And, a new effort to support our successful TCAT Transportation Program involves creating a more reliable funding stream from the Mortgage Recording Tax. This will enable us to replace aging busses with more efficient ones while not causing an increase in property

## SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

At this time of year, traditionally, we tend to look back over our shoulder and reflect how we have faired with the world, family, work, parents, spouses, children, and life

The Town of Danby, in our daytime roles of Highway, Clerk, Bookkeeper, Board Members, Supervisor, Code Enforcement, Judges, and support staff has all the above going on as it works to provide its residents with services that maintain our infrastructure.

This behind-the-scenes work force is dedicated to providing core services, but also to planning for future needs and demands. This work force is a collection of paid staff, elected individuals, and volunteers. All of them have dedicated a significant part of their lives to keeping the town on track...today, and into the future.

On average, in any given month, over fifty people—all committed to making Danby a vital force, locally and in the surrounding communities—must coordinate with themselves and with County boards and services that involve about the same number of people. So I am saying that, to keep Danby operating and to network on projects, means we have to stay on top of a hundred or so people who are working on some aspect of Town business.

I want to thank all of you, who have lives and responsibilities, for seeing how significant this work force is and for your dedication to making Danby the best it can be.

Early next year our aquifer study will be presented to the Town of Danby, for review and comment. This almost four-year study, mapping Danby's aquifer, brought together State legislators, County representatives, hired consultants, engineering studies, community input, significant numbers of people and enough money to make it happen. It could not be done alone. We needed staff, we needed State support, County and local leaders, and we needed community involvement.

The recent grant funding for the West Danby Water District involved a similar networking effort. The \$400,000+ of this award came about through a group effort. It is an excellent example of a community all coming together to accomplish a necessary task.

Literally everyone in the water district needed to come together and commit to the effort. They send a contin-

gent to Albany; via our local County Representative, meetings were set up State staffers and engineers to scope out the project and write the grant.

It is so impressive when a community can come together, work so professionally together and achieve their goals. Congratulations one and all.

These two examples, along with our biomass boiler, now online using local renewable resources for fuel, and our solar electric installations show us what can be ac-

complished. There are more challenges before us but, looking over my shoulder, seeing the dedication and commitment of our residents, it gives me renewed confidence that we are all in good hands.

the speed limit raised, but most often the interest is in having it reduced on specific roads.

The Town cannot adjust speed limits on County or State roads, but it can request that changes be made. Most recently, the Town Board asked to have Nelson Road speed limit reduced between 96B and Ridgecrest, in anticipation of the Waldorf School opening. The County reduced the speed limit to 40 mph and decided to reduce it all the way back to Troy Road due to residential density.

There has been interest in having a speed limit reduction on Comfort Road, from Miller Road north to NYS Rt.96B. Some of the residents who live on Comfort Road are concerned about the planned expansion of Stork H&E Turbo Blading and what implications that may have on traffic that is already a concern for them.

The Town Board welcomes feedback from residents who travel on Comfort Road. We will be discussing the request for reduced speed in early February. Please let us know your opinion. You can contact anyone on the Town Board or let the Town Clerk know. You can also voice your opinion at a Town Board meeting. Those meetings are held at 7pm in the Town Hall, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of each month.
