## **ELECTION SEASON**

Votes To Take Place During Both November and December

Don't forget to vote in the General Election on Tuesday, November 8! The intrepid, devoted Poll Workers will be ready for voters at 6am in the morning and remain on duty until 9pm at night.

Danby residents may vote in one of two polling places, both located in Danby's Fire Stations. "Uphill" voters use the Danby Volunteer Fire Company on NYS Rt.96B near Gunderman Road. Please park in the park-and-ride lot and leave the apron in front of the building open for use by emergency vehicles.

West Danby voters use the station on Sylvan Lane.

The Danby Community Church is offering an election night supper. You can choose between the traditional pork entree and a chicken alternative. Serving starts at 5pm.

If you can't vote in person on November 8, be sure to ask for an absentee ballot. Contact the Board of Elections at 607.274.5522, 128 East Buffalo Street, Ithaca, or [elections@tompkins-co.org].

You can also sign up to be a Poll Worker at the Board of Elections. Taking part in our nation's democracy is both well appreciated and satisfying.

Looking Forward to December Danby's Fire District holds its election on Tuesday, December 13. Voting hours are usually limited to the evening time, 6-9pm. This year, the District's lawyer has advised that it is only allowed to open one polling place, and the "uphill" Fire Station on NYS Rt.96B will be used. The District is planning to provide a shuttle bus from West Danby.

#### BOARD VACANCIES

The Town Board of the Town of Danby invites residents to apply for volunteer municipal boards. Your involvement is welcome and needed.

Each year, one seat opens on the Planning Board and another seat on the Board of Zoning Appeals. The Planning Board term is seven years, while the BZA term is five years.

The Planning Board meets monthly, currently on the third Thursday, to review subdivision and development applications, and to review and revise the Town Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance. The Board of Zoning Appeals meets as needed, currently on the fourth Tuesday of each month, to hear and decide variance requests related to the Zoning Ordinance. Copies of the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance are available on the Code/Planning page of Danby's web site and in the Town Clerk's office.

There are several open seats on the Conservation Advisory Council. The CAC advises the Town Board in the de-

velopment, management, and protection of the Town's natural resources. The full charge of the CAC, which includes making recommendations to the Town Board for Conservation Easements on property in Danby, keeping an open space inventory, and drafting management plans for Town properties, is available in the Town Clerk's office.

There are open positions for Town Historian and Town Webmaster. As provided by


## Town Clerk's Desktop

## WEST DANBY WATER DISTRICT UPDATE

This may be old news to many of you who witnessed the work on Hillview Road and on Spencer Road where it intersects Hillview, but we had two large water

leaks in that area at the end of September.

Our daily water consumption rose to around 100,000 gallons on September 13. One day of search located the leak on Hillview Road, where it intersects the highway. It appeared that mowing equipment had hit a valve riser and jarred the pipe below it to cause the



leak. Minteer Construction came out to excavate and repair the leak which was on a 3" line where it meets the valve.

Once that was repaired, we immediately developed another, similar-sized leak; our consumption rates never noticeably dropped. Another day was spent trying to locate this one and it was found on the 6" main very near where the highway meets Hillview Road. Again, Minteer came out to excavate and repair the line. This time our consumption did go back down to roughly 15,000 gallons a day.

The irony of the situation is that in this summer's drought we were particularly concerned about losing so much water. It turns out that the extreme dry conditions may have helped to cause the pipe to break. Dave Herrick from T.G. Miller, coincidentally, called to ask how our water system was doing and I described to him our leak situation. He told me of other water systems around the area that experienced similar situations. They determined that the drought had caused ground conditions to shift enough that the pipe was no longer bedded properly and a jarring incident that would normally not affect the pipe could burst it.

I am happy to say that the big leaks are repaired but we still are in a drought so I guess the dangerous situation for our distribution lines still exists.

There are a few residences that are using unusually large amounts of water and I hope that homeowners will take care of any possible leaks. Please feel free to call me at 607.280.1823 if you have questions about what you can do to find or repair them.

#### FIRE DISTRICT BUDGET

During the summer and early fall, the Danby Fire District's Commissioners develop a preliminary budget for the upcoming fiscal year. The 2017 Preliminary Budget was filed with the Danby Town Clerk prior to the October 3 deadline, along with an official notice of a Public Hearing for comments on the budget, scheduled for October 18, 2016.

The proposed 2017 Budget expenditures totals \$514,000, which is below the NYS-mandated tax cap of \$514,702. Thanks to a year-to-year increase in the assessed valuation (from new construction and re-assessments) of properties within the Fire District, this budget results in a very small increase (0.63%) in the tax rate, while providing a modest increase in revenue.

The proposed expenditures for 2017, in declining order of value, are:

- Principal and interest payments for debt on two stations, two engines and the new, under-construction tanker
- Firefighting expenses and insurance covering fire fighters
- Equipment, apparatus, and station maintenance
- Salaries and payroll-related taxes for our two parttime employees
- Administrative costs.

In addition, we will transfer some funds to reserve accounts and provide for contingencies.

We continue to face several challenges. The first is that, in past years, the apparatus has not been replaced in a systematic way and its average age is now more than twenty years. Two small trucks are being replaced from existing reserves and, therefore, are not part of the 2017 budget. The proposed 2017 budget allows us to replace one additional small truck. One large truck is already under construction, financed by a bond issue approved in February 2016. As of January 2017, we expect to substantially reduce the average apparatus age.

The second challenge is the deferred station maintenance. The proposed 2017, budget together with the use of some reserves, begins to address that issue.

The third challenge is gear and equipment used by fire fighters has aged more than we deem prudent; it is also becoming technologically obsolete. We are applying for a grant to address this challenge.

## SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

Here we are, speeding through October with reasonable to superb weather. So far. Did I just hear an alert from my wife with the word, "snow," in it?

This is a catch-up period for me, as I have been out of the action for a while, taking care of myself. I have been blessed with a wonderful life, of work, family, and community. It's been so good that issues pertaining to health have taken a back seat for me.

There's never a a good time to do something you need to do but do not want to do. So I have taken some time this fall to address health issues. I will be back as a player, as soon as a good recovery lets me. Right now, I feel like a helicopter parent watching from the sidelines.

I am definitely grateful for the fantastic support I'm getting from our Town staff at this time. Thank you one and all for your team efforts. So, here's some things that have progressed during my absence.

#### PPA and Solar Array at Highway

The Town is on track to satisfying much of its electrical needs through Solar PV energy. The process began when the Town received the right to a favorable rate for energy we generate. We can sell power to NYSEG for more than we pay for the power we use!

The Town went through a permitting process with the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation to allow the construction of a 100+kW array at the Highway Department. We've negiotiated with funders (there will be little, if any, up-front cost) and solar installers.

Beyond the needs at Town Hall, we've reached out to the other governmental power consumers in Danby, in-

The fourth is that critical water availability has not been expanded nor improved. We have increased our moneys for that in 2017.

The fifth is that we need to recruit volunteers and that means increasing recruiting costs. We have allowed for that in this budget.

Real Estate Taxes remain the principal source of income for Danby's Fire District. Our volunteer emergency responders, together with up-to-date fire protection technology are part of the modern civilization that your tax dollars support. All of our volunteers thank you!

cluding the Highway Department, the Water District, and the Fire District. Most have signed on.

It is our intent to provide electricity for the lowest cost possible, and the Town itself expects to save money starting on Day One. We have considered the option of a "buy out" after ten years, and begun setting funds aside for it in the 2017 budget. If the "buy out" is taken, we would own our own power generation and pay nothing—or close to it—for electricity for as long as we'd care to maintain the equipment.

In short, the project protects taxpayers from the get-go, and the savings could increase dramatically over time.

#### Planning and Growth

Verizon has proposed a 110' telecommunication tower for property owned by and adjacent to the American Legion on Danby Road. The results of a balloon test have not yet been received. The Town has limited authority over the tower siting so, barring unexpected results from the balloon tests and other environmental considerations, the tower will eventually be erected.

The Town is allowed to introduce enhancements to the NY State Environmental Quality Review (that's SEQR). Our existing local SEQR law needs to be updated to reflect current State law and to further clarify our groundwater protection regulations. We will also alert potential developers to potential problems in regulatory or compliance issues early on during the application process.

## COUNTY LEGISLATURE UPDATE

Nineteen of the 62 counties in New York State have what is called a, "charter government." Tompkins County has a charter government. Non-charter counties follow rules of operation set forth by the State. Tompkins decided in 1968 to write its own set of rules to organize and structure its County government, and this is our charter. You can think of it as the constitution of Tompkins County.

Approximately every ten years, we review the charter to see what needs to be changed. We read over every word in the 41,000 word document—multiple times—and have had long discussions about what changes we want to make.

We are proposing over 300 changes, most of them very small. Here are a few of the more significant changes being proposed:

- Several County departments will have name changes: the Personnel Department will become the Human Resources Department, Planning will become Planning and Sustainability, and the Division of Solid Waste will become the Department of Recycling and Materials Management.
- Some of the changes involve updating the charter to more accurately reflect our current practices. Some examples of this include outlining how the budget is put together and presented, and updated charter information about the Office of Workforce Development to align with a new Federal law.

- A big change we are recommending is to formally incorporate the process of establishing an independent redistricting commission. Every 10 years, after the census, we adjust our election district boundaries. In 2012, we were the only county in New York to use an independent redistricting commission. Now, the charter would require us to do so in the future.
- In 2015, there was some controversy surrounding two special elections that were held to fill vacant County Legislature seats. We were able to partially address one issue that was raised, which concerned the short length of time given to campaign for special elections. We added 10 days to the campaign schedule. We are trying to strike a balance between providing sufficient time for campaigns while not allowing the residents of any district in Tompkins County to be without a legislative representative for too long.

The County Legislature will hold a public hearing on Tuesday November 15, 5:30 pm, in its legislative chambers, to hear from any member of the public who wishes to comment on the proposed charter changes. #### **EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES**

During the past 18 months, the Danby Fire District responded to 237 Emergency Medical (EM) calls. EM calls comprise about 60 percent of the total number emergency runs (about 400 total, during the same period).

During the same 18-month period, the EM calls can be divided into

- heart/breathing issues, 22%
- other medical issues, 58%
- motor vehicle accidents, 10%
- others (including hazardous conditions), 10%

In all, our Emergency Medical Technicians provided more than 600 hours on calls!

Ten percent of our volunteers—6 out of 60—are trained Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs). We rely on Bangs Ambulance and several air ambulance services to transport patients to medical facilities like Cayuga Medical Center. We need several more volunteers for these very important EMT positions; the greatest need is at the Danby Fire Company.

Training for an EMT goes way beyond fire fighting skills. The EMTs work and train alongside firefighters, but the EMTs receive additional medical training.

Tompkins County, like many other areas of New York State, has a growing need for EMTs. Unfortunately, as the demand increases, the aging and declining EMT volunteer pool limits the availability of crucial services. In the past year, one regional volunteer ambulance service ceased operations and other Tompkins County EM services are struggling. Some municipalities now utilite commercial services or paid staffing to meet the EM needs of their citizens.

Two takeaways for you, dear reader:

- We welcome volunteers for the critical job of EMT. You can learn more and even start the application process by visiting either fire station, Danby or West Danby, on a Monday evening after 6:30pm.
- In the hope of understanding the challenges facing delivery of emergency medical services, the Tompkins County Council of Governments has created a task force, to make recommendations to stabilize and/or improve services. If you have any suggestions, please let us know.
