PITCHING AN ACRE

FOR YEARS, I'VE WONDERED why a square mile contains 640 acres. After all, a square mile is one mile by one mile, and you can't fit a nice round number of acres (each a square, roughly 209 feet by 209 feet) along one side of the square mile.

A radio quiz show question woke me up: It asked for length of a "pitch". No, not a curveball or sinker; this is the pitch that is the bowling area for cricket...and it's one "chain" long. That tweaked my ears because "chain" shows up in property deeds. A chain is 66 feet long.

A chain is ...the unit of linear measurement for the survey of the public lands as prescribed by law. All returns of measurement in the rectangular system are made in the true horizontal distance in links, chains, and miles. (Wikipedia)

For what it's worth, there are four rods (16½ feet each) or 100 links (7.92 inches each) in a chain. Once upon a time, surveyors carried real rods and chains (made of links).

Objection, your honor, what's the relevance? Well, moving right along, 10 chains is a furlong, which all racing enthusiasts know is 1/8 mile. So, 80 chains is 1 mile.

An acre is defined as 10 square chains, that is, 1 furlong by 1 chain, or 10 chains by 1 chain. And, wouldn't you know it, a square mile is 8 furlongs by 8 furlongs, or 80 chains by 80 chains. That's 6400 square chains; since 10 square chains is an acre, a square mile is...640 acres.

When your head stops spinning, you might go back to where it says that an acre is 10 square chains, not 10 chains square. An acre wasn't intended to be square (although it could be); it was intended to be measured in units of 66 feet.

In your property deed's musty history...chains!

To bring all this home to Danby, most of Danby's roads are "three rod roads." In many cases, the land under the roads is privately owned (by you and I) but the Town has a right-of-way that allows the use of a space 49.5 feet wide for public transportation purposes. And you don't pay property tax on the land under the road. ❧

Harvest and Hurricane Time

DANBY AND TOMPKINS COUNTY were lucky during mid-August. We were spared the flooding from heavy and constant rain that caused property and damage to the north and south of us. Life can be like that—heavy with worry and care one moment and as clear and broad as the blue sky the next moment. This is a reminder to take care of regular maintenance and to be grateful for what we have.

The heavy rain in August could also be a precursor to the potential of future flash flooding when hurricane season blows through during the Autumn. When the ground is saturated, there can be nowhere for heavy rains to go...except down the roads, under culverts and bridges, and through ditches. If there are blockage along the way, access can be cut off. As we are reminded from emergency alerts—don't drive through flowing water on road ways. The water may be deeper than you think or the road may have been washed away. Go to higher ground, especially if your home is in a flood-prone area. Act swiftly to protect your life and property.



Tompkins County is rolling out the *Swift911* emergency alert system. It can give you notice of weather and road emergencies directly via your computer, phone, or mobile device. The information can be targeted to the locations where you live and work. Consider enrolling today; to find out how, Google “Tompkins County Emergency Notification”.

Hunting Time, Too

September means that hunting license season is upon us. Residents with lifetime licenses have been making the trip to the Clerk's desk to get permits—such as bowhunting tags—that are not mailed directly. Hunters have also been coming in for *Deer Management Permits*, which allows hunters to take additional antlerless deer during the regular hunting season. Hunters may apply for up to two DMPs, which are assigned or awarded by lottery system. Certain people, such as disabled veterans and landowners with 50 or more acres of contiguous land, receive a preference on DMPs. Deer Management Permit applications can be purchased at the Town Clerk's office through Monday October 1.

Alex Pfiefer is quickly learning this part of her way Deputy Clerk duties. Either one of us will be happy to help you with sporting license sales, dog license renewals, and handicap access parking tags. We are also available to answer questions about municipal business, to the best of our ability.

Office News

Autumn office hours for the Town Clerk go into effect the Saturday after Labor Day. We will be now open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, 10am-5pm, and Saturday mornings, 10am-Noon. INCOME FROM RURAL PROPERTY

WEST DANBY WATER DISTRICT UPDATE

HUNT ENGINEERS PROVIDED the Water District with plans of its grant-funded project to help alleviate the flooding issue that exists on Station Road in West Danby.

The two culverts in the area where Station and Brown Roads intersect are scheduled for enlarging due to West Danby Creek flooding there in recent years. Originally the project was due to be completed this summer before school opened. Now, it looks like only one of the culverts will be replaced this summer. We are awaiting word from Hunt as to its updated schedule.

J.D. Ferro repaired the roof on the pump house so that we can now look at ways to better organize our inventory of supplies. Minteer Construction repaired a damaged curb box riser at 2147 West Danby Road.

These were all agenda items during the Commissioner meeting held on August 8 in the conference room of the West Danby Fire Station.

Our next meeting will be October 10, 2018, 5:30pm, in the station. ❀



UNEARTHED STUFF

A FEW YEARS AGO a theater "broadside" was unearthed in Town Hall. Not the broad side of a ship or the simultaneous firing of a line of guns; it was a printed broadside, a poster announcing the performance of a play. The somewhat tattered poster was glued to a several sections of wood backing. However, it was in good enough condition to read, and it was fun to discover that it adverted a performance of the play *Little Sunshine* right here in Danby.

The cast of the play is listed on the broadside and there are recognizable names in the cast. It would be fascinating to learn the story of this theater group that performed in our town. Anyone with information is welcome to let me know.

The actual artifact is on display in Ithaca's History Center along with other historic "treasures" from Danby. The History Center's Ksenia Ionova (Community Outreach and Visitor Services) was instrumental in setting up the display and it is worth checking out. And if you have additions or corrections to the presentation, I am interested in feedback.

Danby has other historic treasures that aren't exactly display items—they are in the ground. One such treasure is the foundation and iron items found on a property off Durfee Hill Road. I wrote about it in the July issue of Danby Area News. Research has been done and, hopefully, an archaeologist will be checking out the site. It will be interesting to see what Danby history may be unearthed. Stay tuned. ❀

SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

AS I WRITE, IT SEEMS LIKE RAIN today, rain yesterday, and rain the day before and tomorrow, too. It's wet. The roads, so far, are in good shape and we have dodged the bullet that some communities are grappling with this third week in August.

The question of whether we should put the question—converting the Highway Superintendent's position from an elected one to an appointment by the Town Board—on the ballot for a permissive referendum this Fall came up during the August 20 meeting of the Town Board. The Board believes that the pool of qualified applicants will be larger if it is not restricted to residents of the Town. Ultimately, while the Board must pass a Law to make the change, Danby's residents will be asked to make the decision on this issue.

In other news we are installing a charging station for EV-enabled vehicles and a park and ride bus station across from Town Hall. At the Highway Department, we're adding a new wash bay (enclosed in a new building) plus heat pumps and new insulated garage doors.

The budget process is being moved up a month for staff and board chairs to have more time to address issues in their own budgets. Our finances are good with solid reserves, so some of our new projects will be funded with cash.

In addition to the items mentioned above, the Town Hall renovations are back on the drawing board. Phase 1 of this project will be finished this fall with installation of the charging station. Phase 2, the redesign of front entrance, planters, and a code approved handi-capped ramp, will come later.

You have all seen the issue of the York State lifting the license for Spectrum to operate in New York, an ongoing process that will get resolved somewhere. Danby, with large parts of the Town unserved by Spectrum, could well be a poster child for the problems the State is trying to address. We're not sure what the next moves will be in this game, but we are still engaged in the process.

The Town is also reviewing its forest management laws, regulations, and best practices. This review covers both Highway and land use changes. We're still waiting for the Gunderman Road engineering report in order to make a decision on repairs or committing to a new bridge. Much of our bridge and culvert work is being driven by grants to cover costs.



Community Council Youth Programs

August has come to a close and I'm reflecting upon a successful summer of programming for Danby youth. Over the past two months, I've met a lot of new faces, spent time with the old, and learned alongside new and old together. Summer programs are longer and more relaxed; youth aren't coming to me with the stresses of school, and they're more willing to try new things and to learn. Through collaborations with other adults, as well as through a bit of study on my own, I was able to tackle new projects in more depth.

My favorite project of the summer was spent with a friend and teacher, Nikki Nease, who specializes in teaching herbalism to youth. This program took us all over town. We spent time in Dotson Park, in the Danby State Forest, downtown at CCE, and at the Danby Community Church. Youth learned how to create herbal medicines from start to finish, beginning with plant identification, leading into foraging, and ending with cooking, branding, and presenting the products.

On the final day of the program, we made an appearance at Danby's Food Pantry, where the youth shared their knowledge and doled out the products for free. Many people approached us with excitement and disbelief, congratulating the youth for learning about herbal medicines and thanking us for providing often over-priced goodies for free.

I also learned how to fish this summer. We spent a day casting into Jennings Pond. The sunfish bit pretty constantly and the youth learned the ins-and-outs of rigging poles, attaching bait, and reeling in the line. A few of the more experienced youth helped remove the hooks from the fish, and we released all of the fish back into the pond. A group of girls caught a huge bullhead. While they were waiting for me to find a pair of gloves and unhook it, a snapping turtle swam up and ate it right off the line! Thankfully, everyone was excited—and not terrified—by this spontaneous act of nature.
