

Notary Public Service in the Town Clerk's Office

A S A SERVICE TO RESIDENTS and Town Hall staff, the Clerk's office has two commissioned notaries (Pamela Goddard and Alex Pfeifer) available during regular hours.

A Notary serves the public as an impartial witness in performing a variety of official fraud-deterrent acts related to the signing of important documents. A Notary's job is to assure that the signers of such documents are not falsifying their true identity, that they are willing to sign without duress or intimidation, and that they



are aware of the contents of the document or transaction. As such, we may ask you these three questions: *Do you know what you're signing, are you signing this of your own free will, and to the best of your knowledge is this true and accurate?* And then, we'll want to see a current ID that has a photo, physical description, and signature.

Impartiality is the foundation of the Notary's public trust. They are duty-bound not to act in situations where they have a personal interest, so we can not notarize

our own signatures or any documents that related directly to our personal business.

Anyone can become a Notary by passing a notary public examination, swearing an oath of office, and being commissioned/licensed by the New York State Secretary of State.

In the Danby Town Clerk's office, we most often "notarize" a variety of written documents including deeds, powers of attorney, financial documents (often related to retirement benefits), and pistol permit background checks. If you are constructing a building in Danby —and doing the work yourself—there will be a document related to insurance coverage must be notarized. We sometimes notarize signatures and affidavits or depositions related to grant contracts and other municipal projects.

There is no fee for the service, but you must remember to bring your photo ID (most often, your driver's license) and must wait to sign the document in question when we can witness the signature. Feel free to call our office, 607.277.4788, with any questions.

Tax Collection

After January 31, we will have gotten over the hump of Town and County property tax collection—but we won't be done with it. Alex Pfeifer and I continue to collect property tax through the end of March. However, the installment option is no longer available and a service fee of 1 percent per month is added to the tax bills.

Please note that it is the responsibility of the property owner, whose taxes are not paid by an escrow service, to notify the Clerk's office if they have not received their tax bill. We can send a duplicate copy of bills by fax, Email, or regular mail as needed. Due to limitations of our computer software system, tax payment records are not available via the internet. Payment must be made by cash or check. We are not set up to receive credit or debit card payments.

For taxes, dog license renewals, and notary services, the Town Clerk's office will be open 10am-5pm, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, and 10am-Noon on Saturdays through the Spring. Please note that the office will be closed the Saturday of President's Day weekend, February 16. As always, we are closed on Thursdays and Sundays...and the chocolate bowl remains well supplied.

COUNTY LEGISLATURE UPDATE

HERE IS A ROUNDUP of some of the issues the Tompkins County Legislature is working on.

The Tompkins Center for History and Culture is a new venture housed in the former Tompkins County Trust Company building on the Commons. It is scheduled to open in April and will house a variety of not-for-profit organizations. The idea is that with shared resources, these organizations will be more efficient and may be able work together in mutually beneficial ways.

The largest tenants of the Tompkins Center for History and Culture will be the History Center and the Tompkins County Visitors Center. It will serve as a place for visitors to Tompkins County to go to receive information, and will also have public history displays. The County just approved the newest office tenants to the building: Discover Cayuga Lake (which runs the Floating Classroom), the Cayuga Chamber Orchestra, and the Ithaca Festival. The venture is set up with the idea that the County will break even in operating the building by the rent paid by the tenant organizations.

I have written before about the collapse of the worldwide recycling market. I recently found out that the glass we put in our recycling bins is ground up and used industrially a second time, but it is not truly be-

With this in mind, the County expressed its support to New York State to expand the bottle bill to assign a 5 cent deposit to glass juice, tea, coffee, and liquor bottles. The idea is that this would put the responsibility on the glass manufacturing industry to find ways to recycle. If this is going to work, it will probably be a few years before we see the results.

Sales tax collection was way up in Tompkins County from 2017 to 2018. Danby shares in this revenue. The amount Danby will see from 2018 is about 9% higher than the year before.

I have been putting a lot of work into the issue of County-owned forest lands. Tompkins County owns about 450 acres in Newfield and 100 acres in Caroline. These were farm fields abandoned in the 1930s. The County is planning on logging 162 acres in Newfield. I am instead proposing that we don't cut the trees and allow these publicly-owned forests to mature into oldgrowth.

The logging issue might be resolved by the time you read this. Or there may be a final vote on February 5. Go to [tompkinsoldgrowth.org] for more information, or contact me directly.

SUPERVISOR'S UPDATE

ONE OF THE BIG QUESTIONS that I frequently ask myself is, "How can I make Town of Danby topics relevant to residents?"

Roads are a good example. Danby's dirt roads are a fact, its paved roads are few, and that will not change in the forseeable future. I have worked with five highway superintendents and all of them have tried to address seasonal damage to roads. All along, the Highway Department has struggled wit hthe obvious question: Why can't we get it right?

Our roads are, for the most part, old and follow paths laid down by past generations of Danby settlers. They were not built with an eye toward the high volume of vehicles whisking over them, or for the enormous weight of some of those vehicles. The roads are not engineered to today's standards and what we now know are basic flaws are compounded by years of failed remediation and by layers of bandaids over flawed subsurface construction.

Sometimes residents tell us that some other Town's roads are good and compare them to our roads. It's a little like comparing apples and oranges and, sometimes, Yuogos with Ferraris. When you look at the underlying materials, the drainage, and the topography, each road is unique; sometimes, each section of a single road is unique.

One thing I have to say up front, people who buy a house on a dirt road might be mindful of dirt road problems: ruts in spring and dust in summer. And

when the ruts don't slow down the cars, we get calls about cars going too fast. This is a fact, dirt roads are a problem that goes with living in a rural community.

The easy answer, to dig up all our trouble spots and rebuild the roads, is not going to happen (see "tax" below).

Throw together the wettest winter I have experienced and widely varying temperatures, and we have additional problems. The Highway Department is trying to remediate the worst damage by applying a stone mix to the road surface. We understand that that's not a permanent fix; we're just trying to make it less worse.

So, yes, we know about this inherited problem but long-term improvements are limited by, you guessed it, taxes. It's conceivable that Highway could fix all our bad roads, but then you probably could not afford to live here. Finding major grants to help fix the worst of the worst and the most expensive is a major part of the game plan. We've already received hundreds of thousands of dollars for the most urgent road infrastructure repairs.

There's no quick and easy solution to rough roads this winter, but we do take this problem seriously. We are open to problems on your particular road and ask you to please help us by alerting highway to problems and to work with them to remediate.


